





## Harvesting Healthy Habits Hand-in-Hand

Harvesting Healthy Habits Hand-in-Hand is a project that we as the student council at the Classical Christian Co-op of Nazareth began to encourage our fellow students to act with good habits while developing virtues. It is an informal study of what the Bible says about



virtues, and, also, to share our ideas, so we can grow together. As Hebrews 10:24-25 says, "24 And let us consider how to stir up one another to love and good works, 25 not neglecting to meet together, as is the habit of some, but encouraging one another, and all the more as you see the Day drawing near."

Our purpose is to instill the desire to practice good habits as a formation of character. There are picture frames around the church with different examples (stories, quotes, etc) of the monthly virtue. Bible passages about the monthly virtue are posted on the co-op bulletin board in the back-half of the Social Hall. We hope to connect the co-op and the church communities through this program.

So, look around! Join us in focusing on God's gifts to us and being formed by them. The emphasis for the month of June is PEACE, so I offer you this Scripture to begin the month:

## Pastor's Answers

## Ecumenical Moment: Non-Denominational Music



Okay, so "nondenominational music" is not really a thing, but beginning from the 1970's, we have our nondenominational brothers and sisters to thank for most of the music we use in church that is done in a popular style.

When I was a youth minister back in the 1990's, Peter Jennings—who was a Lutheran—did a special report detailing the growth of nondenominational churches while more traditional churches shrank. My senior pastor even sent our entire staff to Willow Creek Community Church in the suburbs of Chicago to attend their "Changing Church" conference, which detailed for us the ways that church, which had begun as a youth ministry, had specifically designed its church to be unlike the churches around them in order to reach people that traditional churches never reached. This included the use of youth musical styles in the worship service instead of traditional hymns.

While modern history has shown the shift from traditional to "contemporary" churches to have been a fad (people are actually traveling the other direction right now), the composition of new worship songs using modern song stylings like smooth jazz, R&B, pop, rock, and even country is definitely here to stay. Most liturgical churches like our own use at least some of this music alongside traditional hymnody, choir anthems, classical music, and chant to allow the congregation to express its devotion to God in music.

Thanks be to God for the wondrous diversity He inspires in the faith of His people!
