
> Sponsors can pick up their flowers by the Monday after their sponsorship date. Any flowers left after Monday will be used for sick & shut-in visits.

Harvesting Healthy Habits Hand-in-Hand

Virtue of the Month: LEADERSHIP

Jesus is the only perfect leader, but we can still strive to be good leaders. We should follow God and not lean on our own understanding. Jesus is a warrior King, but also a suffering servant. To

lead is to serve those who you are leading, like Jesus humbly becomes the servant. A good leader is wise, but still listens to those around them, just and fair, but also compassionate and merciful. A good leader leads by example, taking responsibility for both failures and successes.

"When he had washed their feet and put on his outer garments and resumed his place, he said to them, "Do you understand what I have done to you? You call me Teacher and Lord, and you are right, for so I am. If I then, your Lord and Teacher, have washed your feet, you also ought to wash one another's feet. For I have given you an example, that you also should do just as I have done to you. Truly, truly, I say to you, a servant is not greater than his master, nor is a messenger greater than the one who sent him. If you know these things, blessed are you if you do them." - John 13:12-17

On Sunday, June 15th, our after-church question and answer sessions produced a question that I have heard several times since becoming the pastor here; "Why did we switch from "sins" to "trespasses" when we say the Lord's Prayer? Deacon Michael gave a great answer related to the boundaries surrounding the sanctuary in the Old Testament. I want to add to that here for everyone who didn't attend that discussion.

The version of the Lord's Prayer we say together in worship is from Matthew 6:9-13. The practice of using this version in English-speaking services goes back to at least the same time as when the King James Bible was being translated. In that version of the Bible, the word Jesus uses in the original language—opheleima is accurately translated as "debts," because it is the same word Paul uses in Roman 4:4 when he says, ""Now to the one who works, his wages are not counted as a gift but as something owed"—a debt. When my good Methodist KJV-reading grandfather taught me the Lord's Prayer, I learned it as "forgive us our debts as we forgive our debtors." Later English translators thought that "trespasses" more accurately translated the idea of "debts" than "sins," so that became the more common English rendering of the prayer.

The other place Our Lord teaches a variation of the Lord's Prayer is found in Luke 11:2-4. There Jesus actually uses the Greek word for sin, *hamartia*. While the green hymnal's use of the word "sins" in the Lord's Prayer blends the two Biblical references, it does not reflect the actual words of either Gospel, and so is not technically Scriptural. The reason it was probably chosen is that the editorial committee of the green hymnal was really interested in "updating" worship language to be more modern... that's why the words to the Christmas songs are so different from the ones you know from the more traditional ones sung on the radio!

You can certainly use either version of the prayer, but our choice to use "trespasses" in worship is a reflection of our commitment as a congregation to remain as firmly rooted in Scripture as possible.

UPDATE– Holy Cross Emergency Response Team

Have you noticed the appearance of red lanyards worn by certain attendees at church functions and services recently? These lanyards are used to identify the dedicated members of our congregation who have been training to respond to any emergency situation they may encounter.

Several "behind-the-scenes" initiatives have been completed by the ERT since the start of 2025. However, one of our most visible was the live congregational fire evacuation on Sunday, June 29th. A second live drill will be conducted on <u>Sunday</u>, <u>September 28th</u> when we will test our response to a shelter-in-place scenario, such as a chemical spill or severe weather threat. Exercises such as these are beneficial in measuring the capabilities of our team members and to remind the congregation of their responsibilities during an actual emergency. *Your understanding and cooperation during these drills is greatly appreciated.*

Future plans for the team include:

- Completion of an updated written Emergency Action Plan to be presented to church council for approval before the end of summer;
- A site visit to Holy Cross from local fire companies to practice their response to a fire emergency. This exercise will be held on a Monday evening in September with the actual date and time to be announced. The ERT will be in attendance to observe. Interested church members will also be invited to attend;
- In cooperation with other Lehigh Valley houses of worship, active shooter response training is being planned for a date this fall. Holy Cross ERT members will be included in this critical session;
- Later in the year ERT members will attend the Emergency Training Center for hands-on training in the use of fire extinguishers and experience in an actual smoke-filled environment.

The team meets quarterly to train for emergencies. Our next meeting is scheduled for <u>Saturday</u>, <u>August 2nd</u>, 10:00am—noon. New members are always welcome.
