

This weather conjures up memories of my childhood, with the hot, slow breeze carrying the vague but clearly-identifiable smell of Queen Anne's Lace, chicory, and dry, browning grass—the smell of high summer—through my bedroom screen.

The gifts of His creation are wonderful in and of themselves, but to share them with He who gives them is what can make the time truly special.





Harvesting Healthy Habits Hand-in-Hand

Person of the Month: Monica, mother of Augustine

As we move toward the fall, the Classical Christian Co-Op of Nazareth has decided that rather than focusing on a particular virtue, they are going to focus on the examples of great Christians of the past—people often referred to as "saints." Not only are these people great exemplars of virtue, they are practical examples for us of how these virtues can help us live an active life of faith in Christ, a life that impacts the people and culture around us positively.



This month we are remembering Monica, the mother of St. Augustine. Featured in our July 27th sermon, Monica's ministry was one of perseverance in prayer and patient love for her never-do-well son. "Throughout her life she sought the spiritual welfare of her children, especially that of her brilliant son, Augustine. Widowed at a young age, she devoted herself to her family, praying many years for Augustine's conversion. When Augustine left North Africa to go to Italy, she followed him to Rome and then to Milan. There she had the joy of witnessing her son's conversion to the Christian faith."

Monica's decades of devotion and prayer are a great example for us all as Christians. We are called to perseverance in love and sacrifice for the sake of those around us. Since Luther was an Augustinian monk, Monica's quiet ministry continues to touch us, even to this day here at Holy Cross.

Pastor's Answers

From our Sunday Sessions:

Why the New Music?



This summer we are all getting exposed to new music at worship; the 10:30 crew are experiencing the 8:00 Lutheran Book of Worship liturgical music, and the 8am crew are now getting exposed to the way the 10:30 service worships. But there is more new music than even this; the *Kyrie* ("Lord, have mercy") and hymn of praise music are now different than either group has used before. Why?

The answer is that what we repeatedly pray and sing forms us more spiritually than any sermon, no matter how powerful, possibly could. The early Church even had a formula for this: *Lex Orandi, Lex Credendi,* which loosely translates to "as you pray, so will you believe." This is so true that even when Christians were being fed to lions and burned at the stake, they would engage in long debates with each other about what words to use in the worship services... they knew that if they said it repeatedly, people would eventually come to believe what they said, and they wanted the words to reflect the fullness of the faith.

While we have certainly been attentive to what we say at both services, the fact that the liturgy of our two services are so different meant that we we were being formed a little differently depending on which service we were attending. The music we are now learning (and it will become second nature in very short order!) means that those who worship at the 10:30 service will be singing the same words as the early service in the parts of worship that are the same from week to week, but using music that fits better with more contemporary songs. The differing styles of our two worship services are designed to let people of different tastes worship at the service whose music is more to their liking while still being properly formed in "the faith that was once for all delivered to the saints." (Jude 1:3) The new music we are learning right now will allow us as a congregation to do that even more effectively and faithfully.

The African Children's Choir will be coming again to Holy Cross on Friday, September 19th.


We are in need of people to help prepare for the performance and serve as ushers and helpers during the performance.

The meeting minutes summarized here are pending Council approval at next month's meeting.

Meeting HIGHLIGHTS for July 9, 2025

Nine members present. Absent: Linda Rissmiller, & Rich Sieafried.

GUESTS: Pastor Brett Jenkins.

Review of Reports:

Secretary's Report - Girl Scout Troop 8881 has requested use of our facility as a new Daisy Troop on the 2nd and 4th Mondays from September to May. Approved by Council.

Treasurer's Report - Category Overview chart provided. General Operating Account Register, Summary of all accounts and Income Statement provided.

Pastor's Report - Pastor's vacation moved to 7/14-7/19. Pastor plans on meeting with staff monthly to go over upcoming events and goals in order to be a resource and provide corrections when necessary. Confirmation classes will begin in October and be held during the Sunday School hour. Attendance in the Tuesday Bible Study has nearly doubled with participants from CCCN. Youth mission trip to Bloomsburg has 15 students, three adult and one junior chaperones. Special thanks to WOA for providing a \$1000.00 gift to offset trip expenses. Gideons International is hosting a free supper for pastors and prospective participants and their spouses on August 23rd. Pastor Brett is unable to attend, but any interested members are invited to participate. Pastor is working on bringing in several ministries to enrich our Christian formation. More updates to come.

Committee Reports:

Emergency Planning - Fire drill went very well. Future planning is in place for the Monroe County Fire Training Center. Cost would be \$1200-\$1250. Date pending. Council approval pending.

Elders - Diane & Gene are stepping down as Elders. Tim and Lois have agreed to participate in a work group. By-laws to be revisited.

Property - Spandrel Glass for office windows is expected in the next two weeks. Install to be coordinated. The AC unit near the Sacristy is leaking. The attic in the garage cleaning process has started.

Social Ministry - June 12th went to Gracedale to visit NW1 wing. Brought small flags to celebrate flag day and the 4th of July. Next visit is July 10th and cookies will be brought for the women.

Spiritual Care Team - Team continues to make cards

and do home visits.

Women of Abundance - See hard copy of minutes.

Old Business:

Picture directory will begin in September. Will start with Council to test. Request for kneelers has been denied. There is not adequate space and the cost is prohibitive.

New Business:

Fire alarm horn was no loud enough during the drill. AJ to review with service company. Pastor also noted a data drop for the streaming computer is needed. Donation letters have been updated. Vocation of Marriage—Pastor preparing a plan to uplift married couples. Discussed the many keys to the building that are out and need to consolidate.

Ending Business/Correspondence:

African Children's Choir to perform on Friday, September 19, 2025. Host families and helpers needed. Outdoor service to be held on Sunday, August 17, followed by a picnic. Returning to two services on Sunday, September 7, 2025. Girl Scout Troop 8881 sent a Thank You and a donation to the church.
